
<u>systems of government are important because</u> they can establish rules/laws that protect the people. Governments also act as a way to enforce the rules. BUT governments should also not be too powerful. Limiting the power of a government is important because it helps keep things fair and equal, it prevents one person or one group of people from having all the power, and promotes the common good.





EXTRA. **Review "Parallel Time Lines" found on pages 24-25 of your textbook. You should be able to:

- 2. Locate events on a time line and be able to sequence events in chronological order.


